LOCAL NEWS

#YOU SAID, WE DID

You said: Rural crime is a priority.

We did: Officers from the Beat Team conducted a Patch walk with the Neighbourhood coordinator, Local Councillor, and other residents in Groby looking for opportunities to increase crime prevention including the installed of cameras around the area.

We did: Theft of caravans and vehicle crime continues to be an issue across the county. Disrupting the people committing these crimes remains a priority. We would encourage everyone to consider crime prevention opportunities. Common things could include fitting of CCTV, use of Faraday bags for keyless cars, fitting of Tracker and the removal of vehicle documents from cars and caravans.

You said: Anti-social behaviour was a priority.

We did: The Beat Team have continued to conduct high visibility patrols in key areas. With only one report of anti-social behaviour received in Stanton under Bardon. The person responsible has been identified and has received written advice and a formal warning regarding any future antisocial behaviour.

You said: Road safety continues to be an issue.

We did: The beat team and colleagues from Hinckley Police Station have been conducting patrols in all the local villages within the beat. This has resulted in the recovery of a stolen vehicle, two arrests for drug driving and recovery of an uninsured and untaxed vehicle which was blocking the highway. We will continue to conduct high-visibility patrols and work with road safety partners.

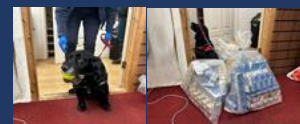


WHOS A GOOD POOCH!

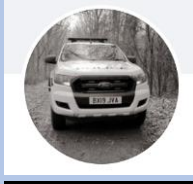

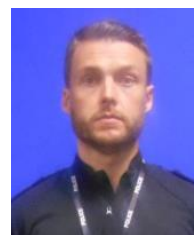

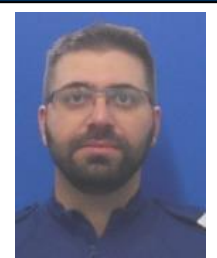
